ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Swahid Peoli Phukan College, Namti a co educational institution emerged as the milestone in the field of higher education in greater Namti under the auspices of the founder Principal Sri Durgadhar Bora and a group of visionary persons in 1970. OBJECTIVES

The gender audit team carried out a comprehensive analysis of the operating environment and studied the government policies and actions formulated for a good gender balanced opportunities and facilities for the students and the teaching and non-teaching staff within the campus. The team also focused on the study and impact of the current and proposed policies of the government on gender equality. The admission process of the college is open for enrollment of the students on merit basis irrespective of their gender and thus offers a choice based education for all. Equal facilities such as separate common rooms for boys and girls, playground for sports, library etc. are provided for both male and female students. A NCC unit for the girls in the college has been a source of inspiration for the cadets in developing their characters and qualities like comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook and spirit of adventure and devotion to a patriotic spirit. The NCC Navy wing has been successfully inculcating similar spirits such as those of NCC among the both boy and girl cadets. Besides, this unit has been providing special training on different aspects and responsibilities of the Navy. The student members of the NSS unit of the college which is comprised of both boys and girls are actively involved in social activities and in creating an environment friendly atmosphere within the campus. Training camps are organized periodically for them in different places for encouraging them to be more responsible in their designated duties. Yoga and meditation camps are also organized periodically for the students. The college makes special effort to sensitize the students about quality performance and overall personality development by inviting eminent personalities from different fields for motivational lectures. STUDENTS STRENGTH (2015-2021)

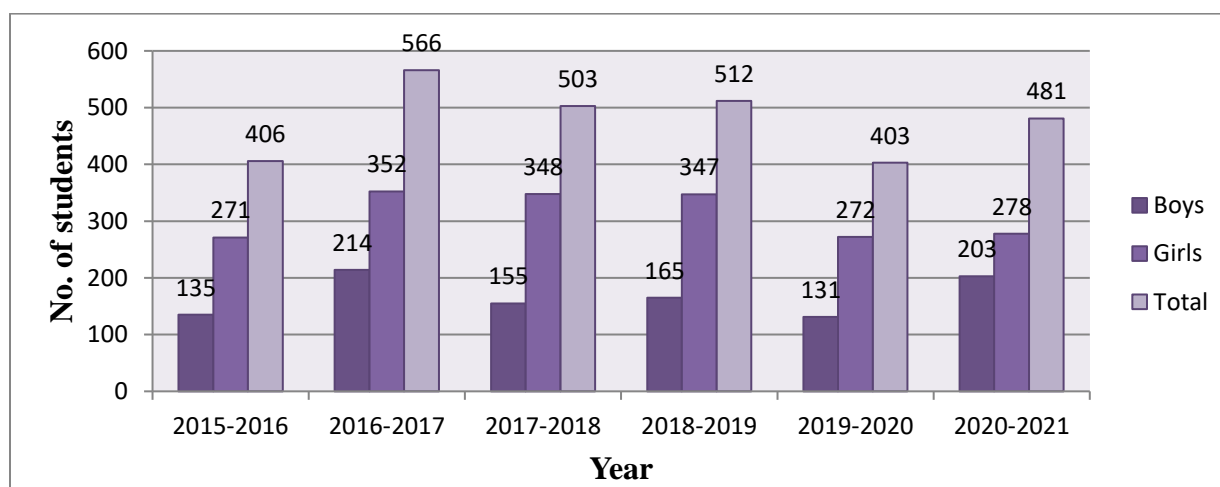

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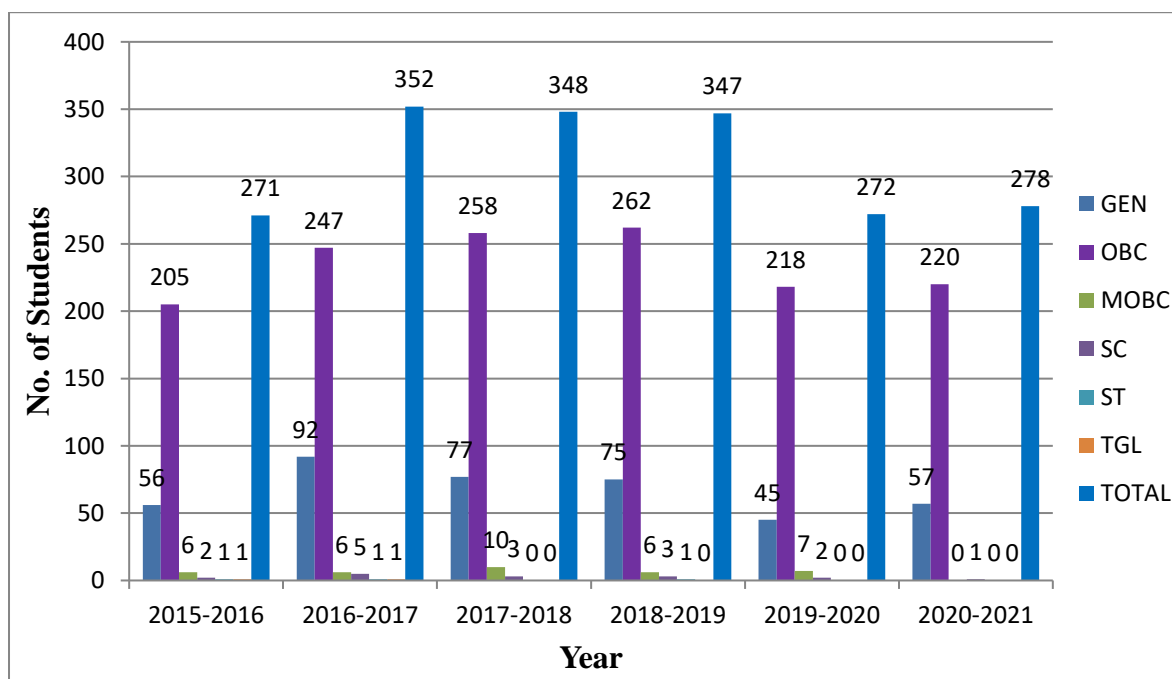

Since 2015-2021, the strength of girls from various social categories is maximum in OBC category and almost same in SC, ST and TGL categories.

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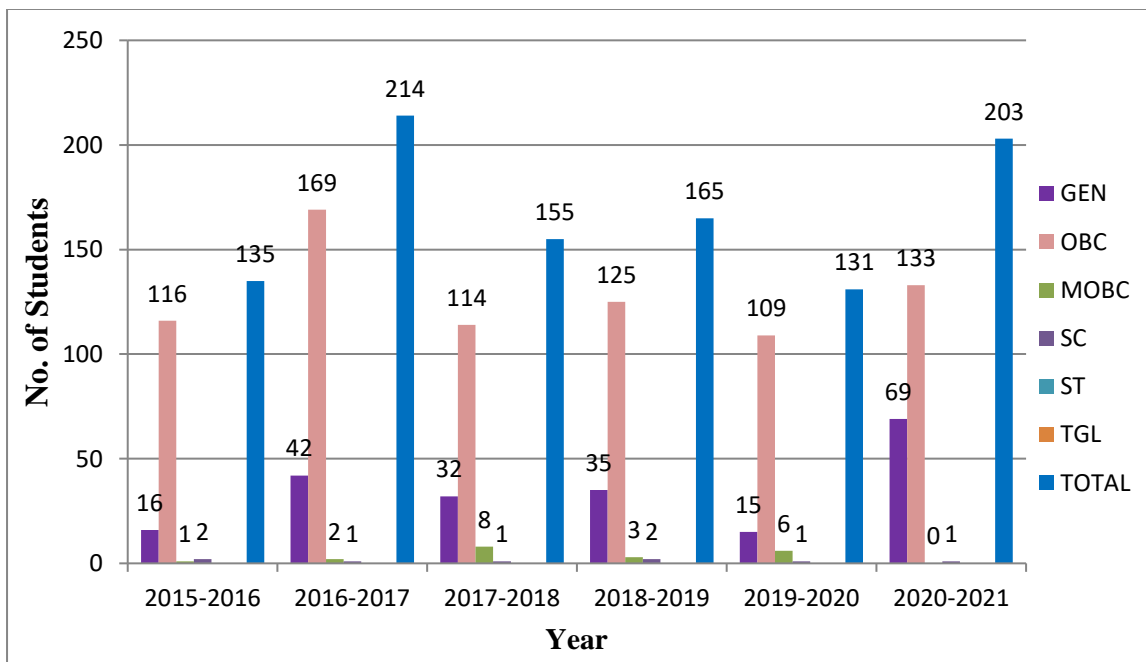

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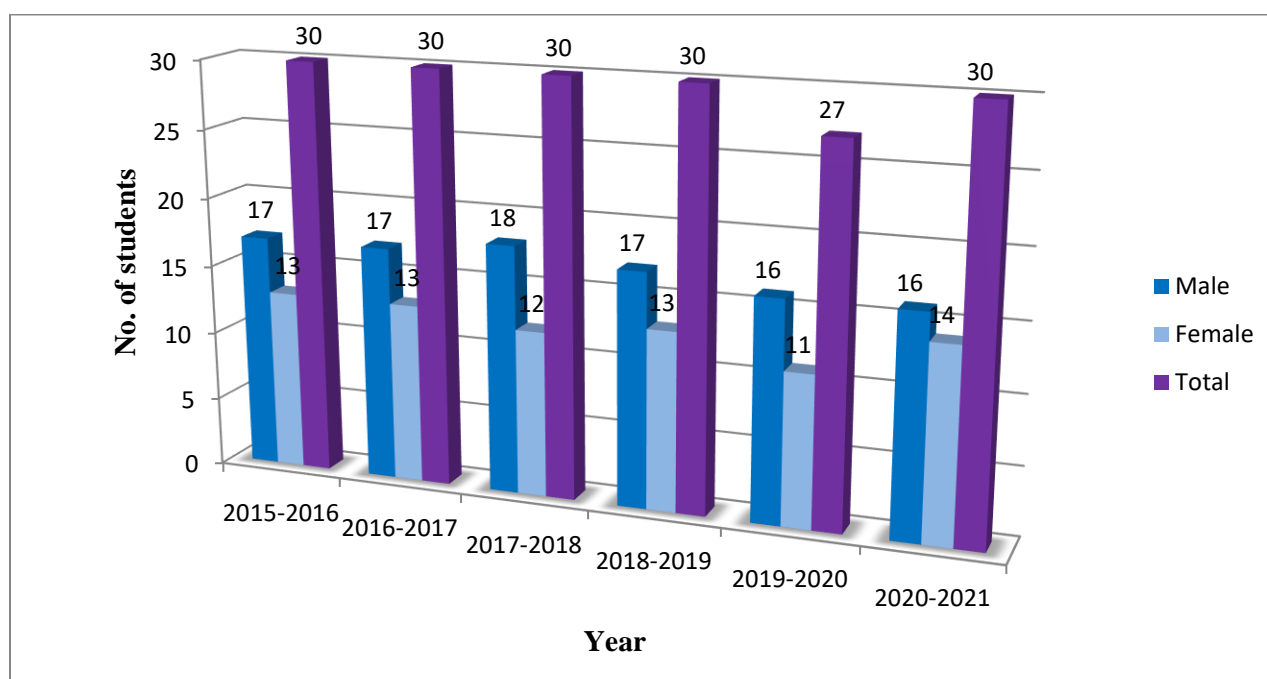

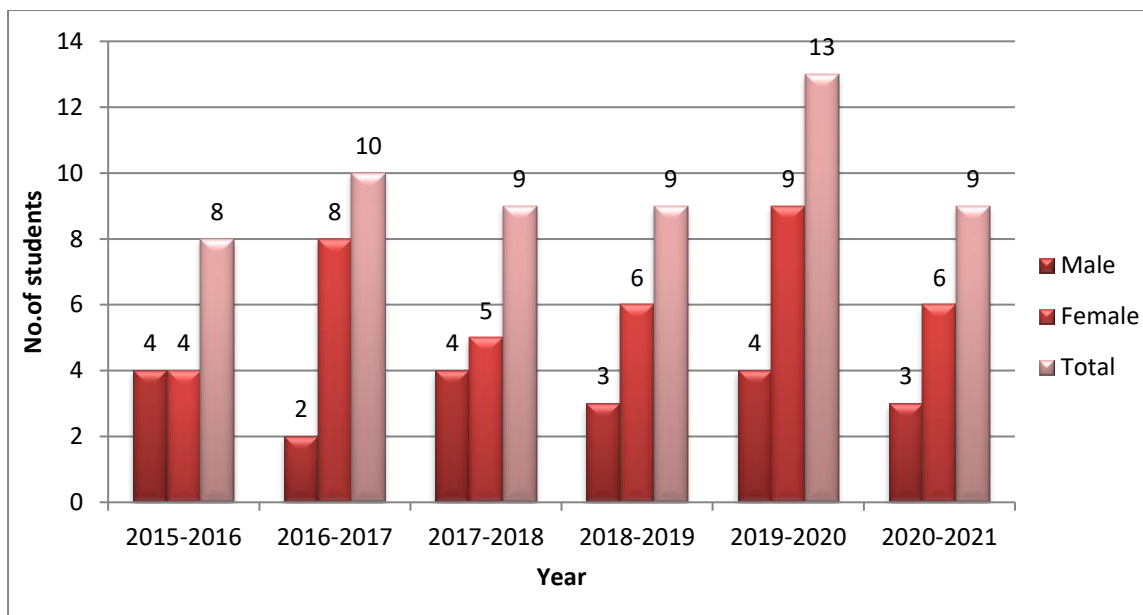

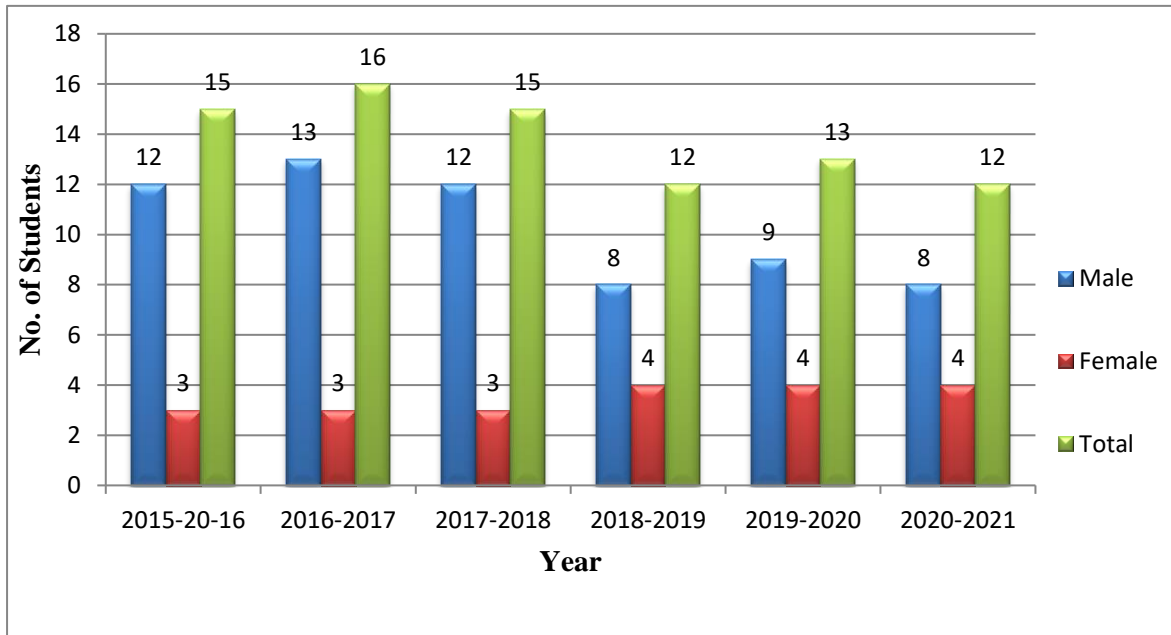

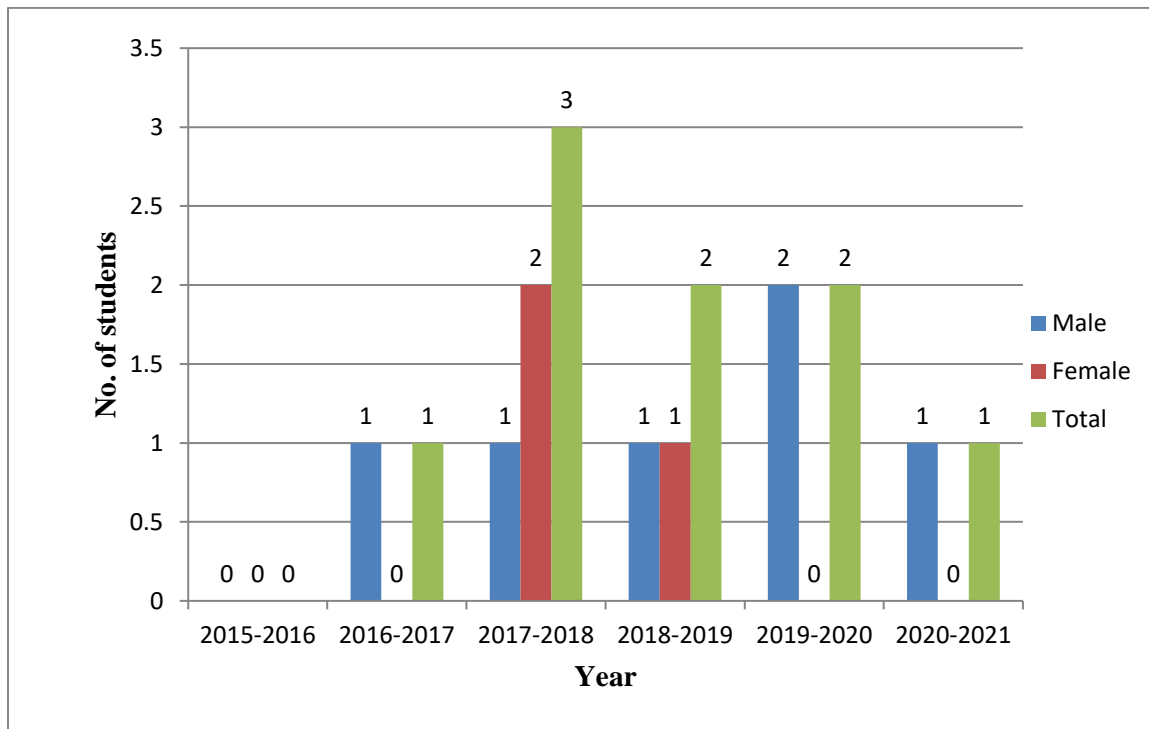

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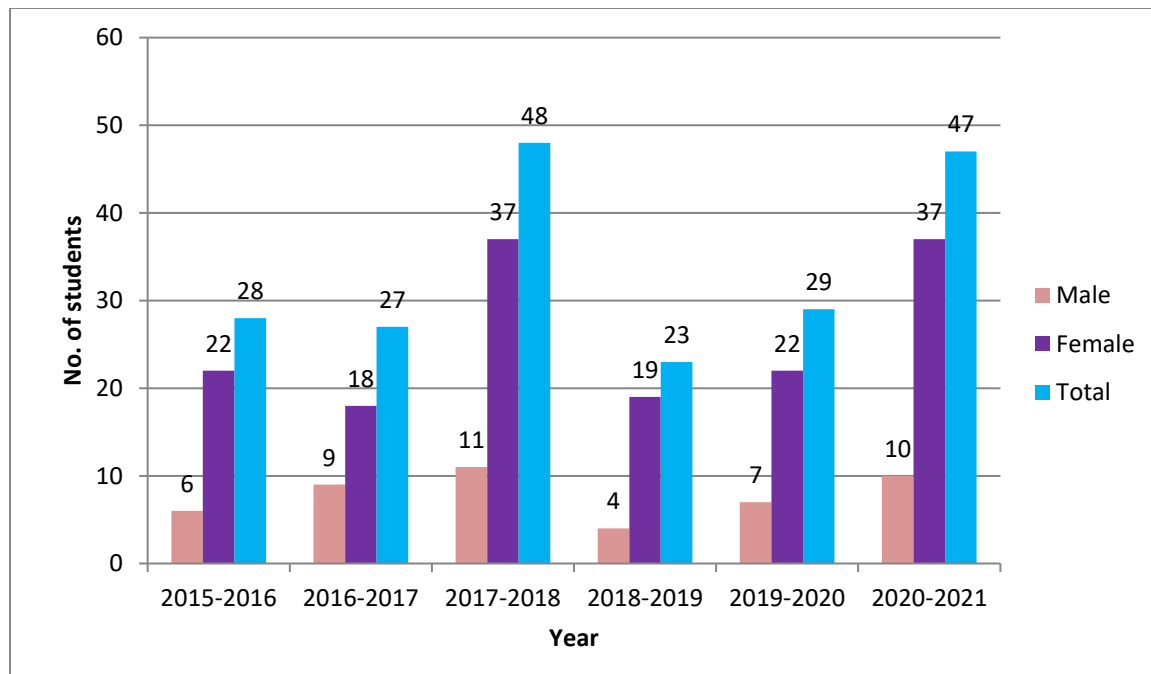

CONCLUSION

MAJOR FINDINGS

- The enrollment of students fluctuated during the period 2015-2021 representing an increase in the year 2016 -2017 followed by a decrease in 2017-2018.
- By and large, the girl's enrollment registers and increases over their male counterparts during the entire period.
- Success rate of girl students is higher than that of boys.
- The number of drinking water pints is inadequate for the students.
- The number of washrooms is not sufficient for both boys and girls.
- Access to smart class room facilities is inadequate as compared to the number of students.
- Most of the cells constituted for different purposes have balanced ratios of male and female members. However currently the RTI cell is constituted only with male members whereas the Gender audit committee is constituted only female members.

SUGGESTIONS:-

- For convenience of both students and teachers adequate number of drinking water points need be added.
- For easy and convenient access to washroom, some more washrooms deserved to be built on priority basis.
- Access to smart classroom facilities should be expanded.
- Sports programmes need to be conducted regularly.
- Awareness drive on legal rights should be organized.
- Focus on participation in sports and cultural activities by students.
- Holding programmes off and on to sensitize the students on gender equality.
- A sanitary napkin vending machine needs to be installed.

CONCLUSION:

The Gender Audit throws light on the role played by the important bodies, committees and cells of the college during the period 2015-2021. The report lists the progress and achievements made by the students and teachers alike. The audit however, mentions the weakness affecting the college. The college administration has extended its full cooperation and help in turning the programmes and schemes into pleasant reality. Efforts on the part of the authority are in progress to fulfill the current needs within the campus.

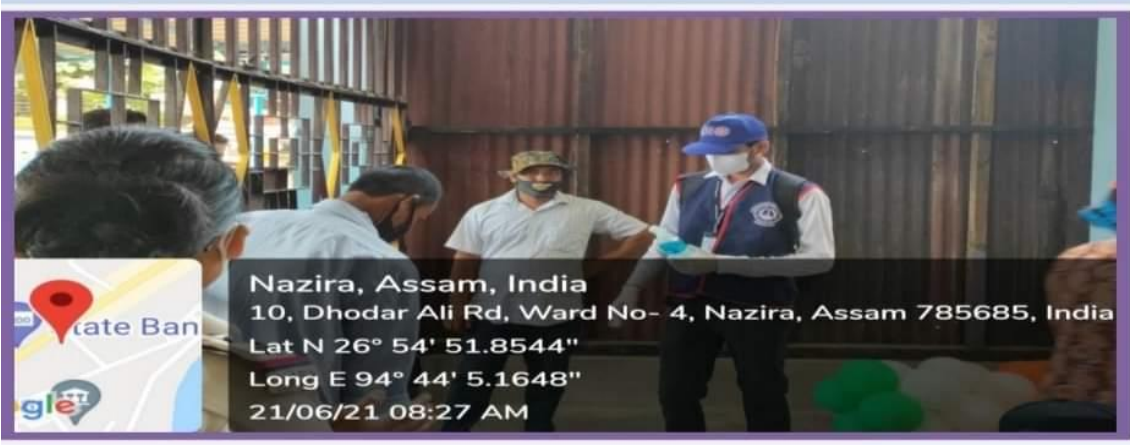

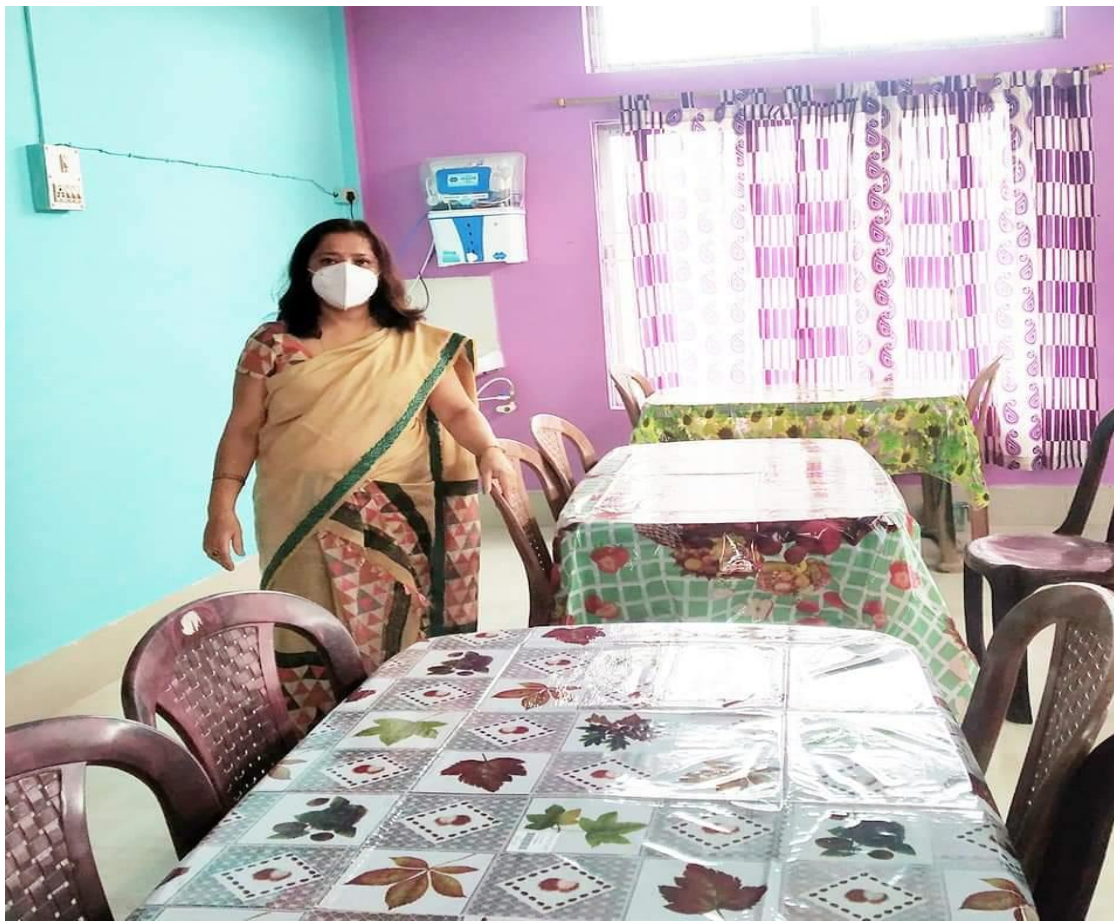


